

RESOLUTION
of the International Forum on Spiritual Harmony,
dedicated to the 30th anniversary of the First Congress on Spiritual Harmony

The International Forum on Spiritual Harmony was held on October 26, 2022 in Moscow with the support of the Commission of the Russian Federation for UNESCO, the Federation Council and the Civic Chamber of the Russian Federation. The participants discussed a wide range of cultural, humanitarian, axiological issues to strengthen interethnic and interreligious dialogue, mutual respect and peaceful coexistence of peoples, continuing the theme of the Congress on Spiritual Harmony, the 30th anniversary of which is celebrated this year.

The first Congress on Spiritual Harmony began its history in October 1992 in Alma-Ata at the initiative of the International Association "Peace through Culture", with the support of the leadership of Kazakhstan. Its participants - prominent religious and public figures from Austria, Great Britain, Germany, India, Italy, Kazakhstan, Russia, the USA, Switzerland and other countries - proposed to declare the opening day of the Congress, October 18 - the Day of World Spiritual Harmony and dedicate the day to prayers and meditations, concelebration in mercy; provide for other forms of understanding and spiritual unity among the people of the Earth. The outcome was the Manifesto of the Congress on Spiritual Harmony, and the initiative was further developed.

In 1993, the Second Session of the Congress on Spiritual Harmony took place in the city of Rishikesh (India). Its participants were representatives of religious denominations, theological schools, and cultural figures. At the session of the Congress, the idea was put forward to create an International Ethics Committee, which would influence the situation in the world with the power of its spiritual authority.

In 2003, the Third Session of the Congress on Spiritual Harmony was held in Moscow. The initiative was supported by the Committee of the State Duma of the Federal Assembly of the Russian Federation for Culture and Tourism, the Institute of Oriental Studies of the Russian Academy of Sciences, the State Museum of Oriental Art, A.M. Gorky Literary Institute and a number of public spiritual organizations.

The ideas of the Congress on Spiritual Harmony were continued by the World Forum on Spiritual Culture (2010, Astana, Kazakhstan), aimed at strengthening the international humanitarian dialogue, respect for the rights of all peoples to peace, friendship and cooperation. The opening of the Forum took place on October 18, the Day of Spiritual Harmony. More than 500 participants from 72 countries attended

the Forum. As a result, the Declaration "Towards a New World through Spiritual Culture" was adopted.

For 30 years, since 1992, in Kazakhstan and in a number of public organizations in other countries, the Day of Spiritual Harmony has been celebrated. There are annual conferences, charity events, thematic events, concerts dedicated to the establishment of mutual understanding and reconciliation between people of different nationalities and faiths, as well as the traditions of mercy.

Since 2017, the initiative has been supported by the Eurasian Peoples' Assembly. The International Action "Day of Spiritual Harmony of the Eurasian Peoples' Assembly" was initiated.

As part of the action, on October 26, 2022, the International Forum on Spiritual Harmony was held. It considered the topics: "On the history of the Congress on Spiritual Harmony 1992", "From Spiritual Harmony to Spiritual Culture", "Transformation and Digitalization: New Super Challenge", "On Passionaries of Eurasianism", "The value of spiritual culture in the context of human development" and others.

The Forum participants were authoritative experts, representatives of public organizations, national-cultural and religious associations from the regions of Russia, Austria, Azerbaijan, Germany, Kazakhstan, Uzbekistan.

Guided by the goals of preserving the spiritual and moral foundations of the human community, educating the younger generation on the basis of spiritual traditions and cultural values, the Forum participants proposed:

1. In the context of challenges and conflicts of the modern world, to consider the comprehension of strategic approaches to decisions that affect everyone as a paramount task for the development of the human community.
2. To support the further development of the International Action "Day of Spiritual Harmony of the Eurasian Peoples' Assembly".
3. Continuing the initiative of the International Forum on Spiritual Harmony, apply to the khokim of the Samarkand region of the Republic of Uzbekistan with a proposal to hold in Samarkand in May 2023 the International Forum on Spiritual Harmony dedicated to the legacy of the Prophet Daniyar (Daniel).
4. As a follow-up to the theme of spiritual harmony, to support the proposal of the Literary Council of the Eurasian Peoples' Assembly to hold in 2023 the forum "Creating the image of a man of the world in children's literature" in Elista (Kalmykia).
5. Publish a collection of Forum materials on the information resources of the organizers and partners.
